

# A Day to End Sexual Violence

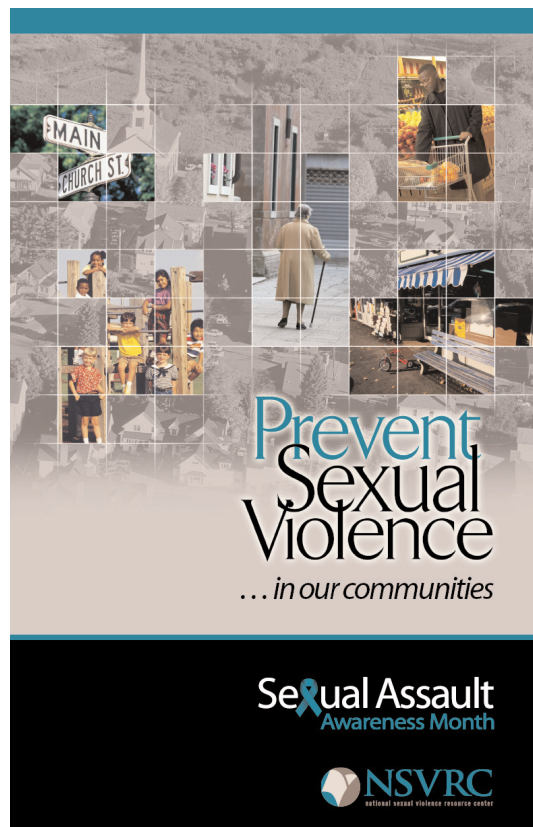
## April 5, 2007 — A Day to End Sexual Violence
