

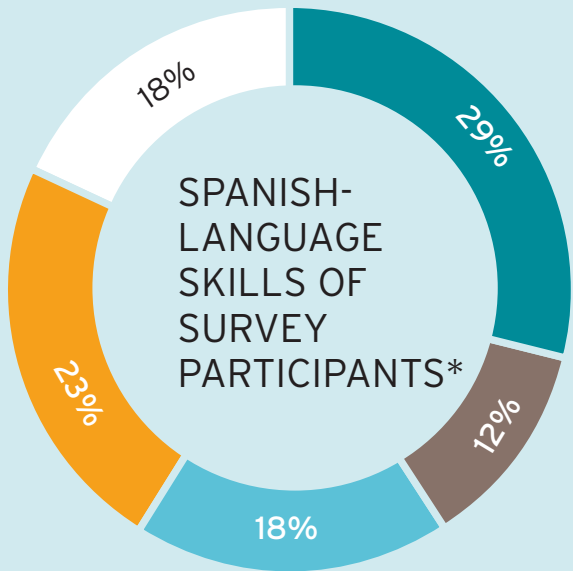
Study examines needs in serving Latin@s

Note: The symbol "@" is used to represent the feminine and masculine versions of words and promote gender inclusion.

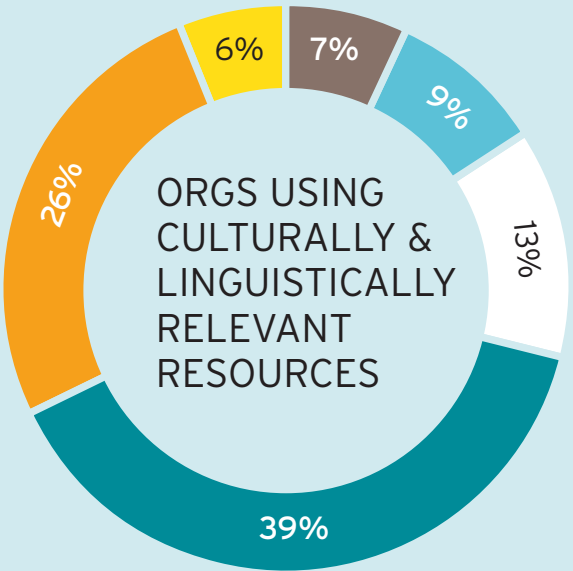

Providers who feel prepared to conduct sexual violence prevention with Latin@ communities

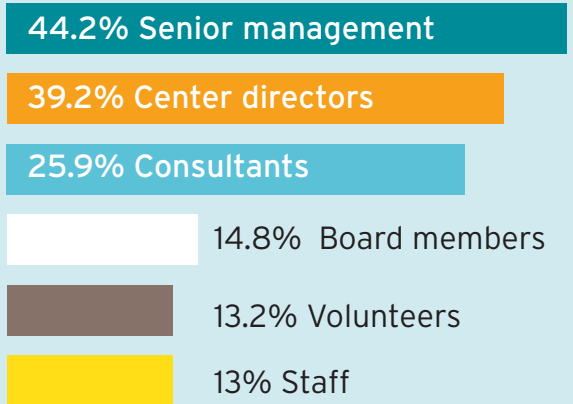


■ Don't speak Spanish ■ General
