


The National Sexual Violence Resource Center (NSVRC), in partnership with the University of Puerto Rico Center for Evaluation & Sociomedical Research produced Preventing sexual violence in Latin@ communities: A national needs assessment to add to the limited body of research on sexual violence in Latin@ and/or Spanish-speaking communities.
