Sexual violence affects many aspects of a victim's life — including safety, health, family, work, and finances. Trauma impacts victims' health and well-being on a daily basis, the broader impact often leads to complex and costly legal questions. Victims often must navigate a complicated maze of governmental and community agencies to receive basic assistance.

SARTs, or sexual assault response teams, help victims navigate the maze.
