It was decided she would be taken to the ER, transported to a detox, and transferred to a safe house in a neighboring county

Is anyone familiar with the Cornerhouse Model?

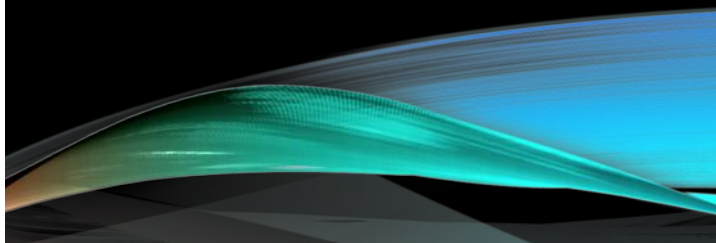
