
AS A COACH, YOU TEACH MORE THAN A SPORT.



How can you help young athletes show respect for their peers?

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Teach your athletes that derogatory jokes may seem harmless, but they maintain environments that support disrespect and, in some cases, violence. These comments can shape long-term attitudes that may lead members of your team to think it's acceptable to hurt others.

Help the next generation foster healthy attitudes:

- Set clear expectations for your players. For example, have a code of conduct that outlines consequences for catcalling or players using gender or sexual orientation as an insult.
- Address inappropriate behaviors and turn them into teachable moments.
- Encourage your team members to recognize and confront hurtful behavior, even if it comes from teammates.
